

SEFLUC Members:

The first of regular meetings between SEFLUC Board Members and key District staff led by Carol Wehle was held on April 26, 2010. The purpose of these meetings is to solicit input from SEFLUC membership on key issues to get our industry's perspective and receive comments and recommendations. These meetings provide an opportunity for communication between SEFLUC members and the District early in the policy development process. Topics for each meeting will be agreed upon during the previous meeting ensuring we are able to solicit member input and discussion. Suggestions for future topics to bring to the District from the members are welcome. The focus of discussion during the June meeting will be the 5 year (or 10 year) permit review process and historical wetland harm policy. In order to communicate membership concerns/comments we need your comments to the questions below on or before **JUNE 1, 2010**.

Questions from SFWMD for SEFLUC to respond to:

- A. CUP compliance update: What **specific** items/requirements should be included in this update?
- B. Historical Impacts to Wetlands: What issues are utilities facing and how do we suggest they be addressed? - Need **specific** examples and suggestions.

Potential Issues for SEFLUC to address with SFWMD:

- A. Population Projections: The five year regional supply updates are underway for the SFWMD area. Historically population projections have been based on medium BEBR and have not been consistent with other existing reports including local planning documents, comprehensive plans, consumptive use permits, utility reporting etc. Inaccurate projections can lead to shortfalls in CUP projections or over allocation of resources. The goal is to unify the projection approach while acknowledging the unique characteristics of various areas and each utility. Any suggestions how to address this problem?
- B. Water Supply Regionalization: The District would like to facilitate regional water resource solutions. Their goal is to formulate a strategy to effectively and efficiently satisfy future water supply needs by providing incentives. What incentives should the SFWMD work on to encourage regionalization?
- C. Other issues suggested by Member Utilities?

Thank you in advance for your participation. We believe these meetings will strengthen a pro-active and collaborative relationship between SEFLUC membership and the District and by first developing consensus among ourselves we will be successful.
